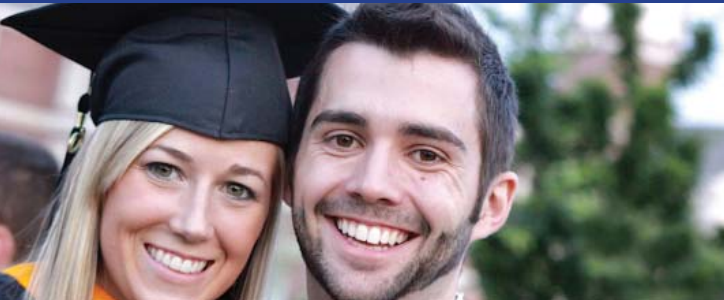

SCHOLARSHIP application



The scholarship will be awarded in \$1,000 increments up to four (4) annual installments, the first installment being awarded upon high school graduation and successive installments when proof of enrollment for the ensuing year has been provided to the Granby Chamber of Commerce.



The following criteria will be used to judge applicants:

- Participation in school activities (band, drama, sports, student council, etc.); include time involvement
- Participation in community activities (non-academic, i.e. scouts, 4-H, volunteerism, mentoring); include time involvement.
- Scholastic standing in class
- Employment history and amount of time worked per week.
- Additional consideration for children of a Chamber of Commerce member.
- Areas of demonstrated leadership.
- Letter of recommendation from a significant person/mentor in your life, teacher, or employer.
- Essay will be weighted most.

Application deadline is the last day of April. Please return answered questions (application) to guidance department at your school; guidance office should include copy of transcript including class rank and return to your Guidance Counselor.

5. The college, university or technical school you plan to attend.
6. Your intended major or focus.
7. Is your parent a Chamber member? (Please provide their business name.)
8. A copy of your high school transcript.
9. A letter of recommendation from someone who has been a mentor to you.
10. Essay: Please tell us about yourself. What events have transpired in your life that demonstrate growth and have impacted you? What are your goals and ambitions? Where do you see yourself in 5 years? 10 years? What should we be looking at that demonstrates this scholarship should be awarded to you?
